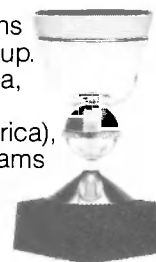
Watch the World's best Canberra'85



The fourth contest for the prestigious World Cup in Athletics will be held in October 1985 in Canberra, Australia. It will be the first time that this competition will be held in the Southern Hemisphere, and the first occasion for many years an event of this stature will see a truly representative entry from the world's foremost athletes.

Teams from eight regions will compete for the World Cup. Europe, Africa, Asia, Oceania, the Americas (Canada, the Caribbean and South America), USA and the two national teams holding first and second place in the European Cup which will be staged in Moscow in August.

Favourites to win these places are Russia and the German Democratic Republic.

Canberra, the beautiful Australian capital is a worthy venue for the World Cup, and will be a new experience for competitors and sports enthusiasts alike, many of whom will be seeing Australia for the first time. Australians will be competing and watching with pride on their home territory.

The Cup will be staged at the National Athletics Stadium at the National Sports Centre, a vast modern complex a few kilometres from the City Centre.

October the second month of spring will see Canberra at its best, a garden city in a landscape setting that attracts millions of visitors every year. With the Australian National University, museums and art galleries, Canberra is a city of learning and culture. It offers as well unlimited recreational activities for visitors.

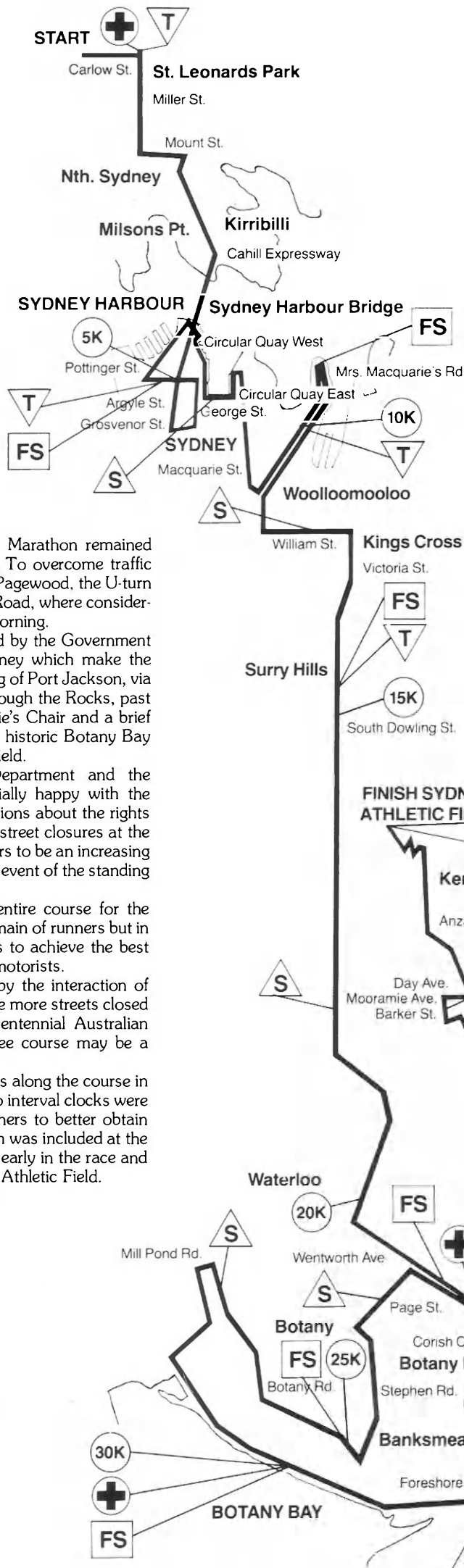

1985 WANG AUSTRALIAN MARATHON COURSE



The course for the 1985 Wang Australian Marathon remained largely unchanged from that used in 1984. To overcome traffic problems in the Wentworth Avenue area of Pagewood, the U-turn section of the course was moved to Botany Road, where considerably less traffic was evident on a Sunday morning.






We are fortunate that the course accepted by the Government authorities retains those landmarks of Sydney which make the Marathon course a special one — the crossing of Port Jackson, via the Sydney Harbour Bridge, the passage through the Rocks, past the Opera House and around Mrs Macquarie's Chair and a brief look at Kings Cross before the long haul to historic Botany Bay and the return journey to Sydney Athletic Field.

After three years the NSW Police Department and the Department of Main Roads remain essentially happy with the progress of the event. There remain reservations about the rights of marathon organisers and runners to seek street closures at the expense of the general public but there appears to be an increasing acceptance on the part of Sydneysiders of an event of the standing of the Wang.

Hopefully the time will come when the entire course for the Australian Marathon will be the exclusive domain of runners but in the meantime the task for race organisers is to achieve the best possible compromise for both runners and motorists.

There were few major problems caused by the interaction of runners and traffic in 1985 but moves to have more streets closed off will continue. By the time that the Bicentennial Australian Marathon comes along in 1988 a traffic free course may be a reality.

The AAU continues to make improvements along the course in the interest of runners. In 1985 the new Seiko interval clocks were positioned at each 5km mark to enable runners to better obtain their split times. An additional medical station was included at the 15km mark for those experiencing problems early in the race and expanded facilities were available at Sydney Athletic Field.
